

RYLA Rules of Conduct

1. Student participants must receive transportation to Camp Rotary. This minimizes many unnecessary issues that can arise with the presence of personal vehicles.
 2. Students may not arrive late, leave Camp Rotary or be dismissed earlier than the published conference schedule, without permission from the RYLA Conference Director.
 3. Student participants will attend all scheduled meetings and activities
 4. Students are to conduct themselves at meals, in the family cabins and during all activities in a manner that will bring credit to themselves, their schools, their families, and their sponsors
 5. **SMOKING IS PROHIBITED**-This is to respect all participants and to avoid a potential fire hazard
 6. **ANY MEDICATIONS**, whether prescribed or “over-the-counter”, must be identified on the containers and given to the Medical Staff for medication Administration (inhalers and epi-pens may be kept on your person BUT Medical Staff and the Director should be notified of the students possession of such medication).
 7. **Alcohol, Drugs and Unidentified Medications are NOT ALLOWED Anywhere at Anytime.** Any student in the possession of ANYTHING, will be immediately discharged from the conference
 8. Recreation activities are limited to those periods of the day and evening available for such activities
 9. **Injuries** must be reported immediately to the Medical Staff and Conference Director
 10. Personal music devices are permitted during free time, evenings and scheduled breaks
 11. **Cell Phones** are an unnecessary distraction and their use will conflict with the objectives of the Conference. If brought, **they must be stored** with your personal gear for the weekend. Cell Phone use is limited within each bunkhouse to the period between the conclusion of our last scheduled activity and the end of our day at “Lights Out”. Additional cell phone use is further confined to the outdoors within the bunkhouse quadrangles and **WILL NOT TO BE USED AFTER 11:45pm.**
 12. Your Family Rotarian Advisor can be entrusted to hold your phone during the day for any anticipated emergency communication. If you are found carrying your cell phone for any purpose, you will be asked to surrender it for the remainder of the weekend.
 13. **LIGHTS-OUT** is a scheduled time contained in our Program. Respect for others requires quiet within the assigned sleeping quarters. This includes the in-house use of cell phone equipment.
- **MEALS**
 - “Family” meals are to be taken together with your discussion group members.
 - “Open Seating” meals are intended for meeting other students and sharing your weekend experience with them as you wish.
 - Each group is responsible for cleaning their eating area after each meal.
